The WCHCT recommended top 6 churches in Warwickshire

1. Beauchamp Chapel – Masterpiece of Medieval Art, final resting place of the mighty Earls of Warwick



2. St Martin, Barcheston – The grave of Sir Thomas Willington and his wife who started of tapestry making in England.



3. St John Berkswell on the edge of Coventry, with an ancient and hidden Norman crypt beneath the church.



4. St Mary Whitchurch is well kept secret lies hidden by surrounding trees in the heart of a field in rural Warwickshire close to the narrow banks of the River Stour.



5. St Peter Wootton Wawen, truly Anglo Saxon and ancient it was old when the Normans arrived.



6. Holy Trinity Coventry, crafted in the 1430's, this spectacular painting of the Last Judgement, also known as the "Coventry Doom", was created above the tower arch.





Sir William Dugdale - 1922-2014



“Bill” Dugdale our longest serving Trustee, who died toward the end of last year was beloved of so many in this his home County. Known universally as “Bill Dugdale” he represented the very essence of the Midlands. Always controversial, fearless, personally, socially and professionally and always forthright there was no mistaking his purpose or values.

His popular claim to esteem amongst the loyal fan base of Aston Villa lay in presiding over the club’s spectacular climb from the third division to the Premier League and their triumph in the ‘81-2 European Cup.

Yet horse racing was his sport of choice. He was passionate in his commitment to racing, riding in the 1953 Grand National before taking on the less dangerous – in some people’s eyes – role of Chief Disciplinary Steward of the Jockey Club. Always prepared to commit to public service he became Chair of the National Water Council and retained his interest going on to chair Severn Trent Water. He was Leader of the County Council in the ‘60s engaged in the Chelmsley Wood development following Birmingham’s slum clearances and laying the foundations for the South West Midlands economy as it came out of the post war economic malaise.

Bill was triumphant in so much that he did, however. Joining the Grenadier Guards he was mentioned in dispatches at Anzio and received his Military Cross at the age of 21 for “outstanding bravery under fire” in Tunisia. After the war he practiced as a solicitor, sat as a JP and was appointed a Deputy Lieutenant for Warwickshire. He was High Sheriff of the County in 1971 and appointed CBE in 1985.

We shall miss his reassuring presence, his sense of the values of tradition, permanence and past achievements, his breadth of vision...and his laughter.

He is succeeded by Matthew (William Matthew Stratford) Dugdale as 3rd Baronet.
