In 2011 The National Churches Trust introduced a new funding scheme, reported on in last year's newsletter. £20,000 was earmarked to be given to churches and chapels in Warwickshire. The NCT set down criteria and asked our trustees to recommend projects that would be suitable to receive these funds. The trustees are delighted to report that all the projects recommended were awarded grants, utilising the full allocation. The scheme will continue in 2012.

News from a grateful beneficiary!

After nearly three years of silence, the fine peal of bells at St Nicholas, Warwick, once again ring out over the town.

In 2009, due to the dangerous state of the spire and tower, instructions were issued that bell ringing should cease, and it was estimated that the repairs to effectively remove and rebuild much of the spire would cost in the region of £250,000.

English Heritage committed £91,000, and the community, with the help of local donations and grants from funders who will support repairs to church buildings, found the shortfall. The Warwickshire and Coventry Historic Churches Trust were very glad to be able to make a contribution to this amount and send congratulations to the project team who managed the work so brilliantly and professionally.



Robert Perkins, PCC member and the project manager, said: 'This has been an enormous challenge for our church. We remain grateful to the W&CHCT for their grant, and I will doubtless be pedalling with some colleagues again for Ride and Stride in September 2012!"

A snapshot of 2011

We are very pleased to report that the money raised on the 2011 sponsored cycle/walking event was £15,500, topping the amount raised in 2010. We wish, of course, to thank everyone involved - the riders, the sponsors, the organisers and the 'hosts' at the churches – for helping to raise this impressive sum. All the money raised goes towards funding repairs to churches across our area.

The Trust are determined to maintain this upward trend and have already taken steps to raise the profile of Ride and Stride. We are hoping that you will be able to give us more help, confident in knowing that the money raised is for the benefit of all who have responsibility for maintaining our priceless legacy of historic churches.

The 2011 total of £15,500 was raised by some 170 riders/walkers who came from only 20% of the churches in Warwickshire & Coventry. Think what we could achieve if every parish took part. Barcheston came out tops this year raising £1261—and the three of them were on horses!

To raise more money, we need greater participation from those not yet so fully involved. If we get more Riders/ Striders out on the day it will instantly transform the amount raised. There are huge variations in the size and resources of our parishes and this will inevitably be reflected in the level of support we can reasonably anticipate. But we have suggested here various ways in which you can help not forgetting, of course, that so many of you already are doing what you can to make the day a success—for which, many thanks indeed!

ARIDE+STRIDE:

Make sure your church is open on the day.

Many churches are open anyway. If possible, do a little more to make riders/walkers feel welcome. Water and soft drinks are always welcome and if you have toilets, please make sure they are open.

If you feel the need, arrange for a rota of 'hosts' to greet riders/walkers. This allows churches with security concerns to be open. Although the Ride is from 10am to 6pm, you may decide to restrict the opening hours to the more active period of 10am - 3.30pm. Don't be disappointed if you only manage to greet a few participants. It's difficult to predict how many visitors you are likely to get!

Publicise the ride as widely as possible within your parish This can be done by word of mouth and by displaying the poster that will be sent to you in advance, but you could also include a paragraph in your parish newsletter or make announcements at other parish events.

Identify a champion to ride for your parish.

One well-sponsored rider in a parish can raise £300 if he or she receives the whole-hearted support of those living there. If every parish did the same we could raise £75,000!


Ride and Stride 2012
