TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

The trustees present their report together with the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2015. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 8 and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015) (SORP 2015 (FRSSE)). Legal and administrative details are set out on the 'Charity Information' pages attached hereto.

Principal activities

The objects of the charity are the preservation, repair, maintenance, improvement, beautification and reconstruction of churches in the county of Warwick, the city of Coventry and such other parts of the county of West Midlands, which are within the diocese of Coventry and of monuments, fittings, fixtures, stained glass, furniture, ornaments, bells, blocks and chattels in such churches and of the churchyard belonging to any of such churches. This is achieved by providing grants to the churches.

Review of activities

The charity continued its principal activities during the year. Grants totalling £21,250 were approved in the period. The trustees consider that the charity will pursue its principal activities for the foreseeable future.

Very bad weather on the day of the 2015 Ride and Stride is considered to be the cause of a reduction in the amount raised to £10,194, less than 2014 when £13,203 was generated. This has reduced the funds available for grant giving in 2016.

Our evening fundraising events continued this year with a midsummer concert at Burton Dassett Church featuring Tamsin Whaley Cohen. The event raised £1,989 for the Trust and increased awareness of its work, thereby encouraging new members.

The Trust also continued to work in partnership with the National Churches Trust (NCT), recommending churches who need larger grants than the Trust can offer, where the projects met the NCT grant criteria.

Results

Details of the financial position of the charity are set out in the following accounts.

The net outgoing resources for the year amounted to £16,691 and the net assets amounted to £13,642 at the year end.

Investment policy and returns

The charity's investments are held in accordance with trustees' powers and the trustees have the authority to invest in such assets as they see fit. The investment returns have been satisfactory, with the underlying investments being a deposit at the Central Board of Finance of the Church of England.

Reserves It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which

are the free funds of the charity, at a relatively high level in order to provide sufficient funds to cover operating costs and grants as required. The trustees consider that maintaining reserves of at least one year's expenditure plus anticipated grants should achieve this

objective.

Risk review The trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to

which the charity is exposed and systems have been implemented to

mitigate those risks.

Volunteers The charity benefits from voluntary donated time.

Related parties The charity has no related parties.
