FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

The trustees present their report together with the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2016. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 8 and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS102)) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102). Legal and administrative details are set out on the 'Charity Information' pages attached hereto.

Principal activities

The objects of the charity are the preservation, repair, maintenance, improvement, beautification and reconstruction of churches in the county of Warwick, the city of Coventry and such other parts of the county of West Midlands, which are within the diocese of Coventry and of monuments, fittings, fixtures, stained glass, furniture, ornaments, bells, blocks and chattels in such churches and of the churchyard belonging to any of such churches. This is achieved by providing grants to the churches.

Review of Activities

The charity continued its principle activities during the year. Grants totalling £5,000 were approved and paid in the period. The trustees consider that the charity will pursue its principle activities for the foreseeable future.

The primary fundraising acitivity, the 'Ride & Stride' event, achieved somewhat smaller returns than those generated in previous years. Brief details of this are given in the following paragraph. Whilst the gross income was reduced, after the elimination of associated costs the net inflow of funds was closer to that of 2015 than might have been anticipated.

During 2016 the Trust experienced changes of Trustee and the resignation of the Administrator. This resulted in a somewhat compressed fundraising timescale, and it was considered prudent to concentrate the Trust's diminished resources on the Ride & Stride event and building up its profile within its georgraphical area of activity. This situation resulted in unfortunately there not being an evening fundarising event, and the documentation for Ride & Stride having to be downloaded from the web, rather than hard copies distributed to churches ahead of the event.

The Trust also continued to work in partnership with the National Churches Trust (NCT), recommending churches who need larger grants than the Trust can offer, where the projects met the NCT grant critieria.

Details of the financial position of the charity are set out in the following accounts.

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £1,189 and the net assets amounted to £14,831 at the year end.

Investment policy and returns

The charity's investments are held in accordance with trustees' powers and the trustees have the authority to invest in such assets as they see fit. The investment returns have been satisfactory, with the underlying investments being a deposit at the Central Board of Finance of the Church of England.

Reserves policy and going concern It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free funds of the charity, at a relatively high level in order to provide sufficient funds to cover operating costs and grants as required. The trustees consider that maintaining reserves of at least one year's expenditure plus anticipated grants should achieve this objective.

The trustees have reviewed the circumstances of the Warwickshire and Coventry Historic Churches Trust and consider that adequate resources continue to be available to fund the activities of the Trust for the foreseeable future. The trustees are of the view that Trust is a going concern.

Risk review

The trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been implemented to mitigate those risks.

Volunteers

The charity benefits from voluntary donated time.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS102)) the Charities Act 2011 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102).

b) In preparing the accounts, the trustees have considered that in applying the accounting policies required by the Charities SORP FRS102, no restatement of comparable items was required.

c) Income recognition

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income, the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy and it is probable that the income will be received.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

d) Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount or the obligation can be measured reliably.

e) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of the charity. Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used for particular areas of the Trust's work or for specific projects being undertaken by the Trust.

f) Going concern

The trustees have reviewed the circumstances of the Warwickshire and Coventry Historic Churches Trust and consider that adequate resources continue to be available to fund the activities of the Trust for the foreseeable future. The trustees are of the view that Trust is a going concern.

2. TRUSTEES' EXPENSES AND REMUNERATION

The trustees all give freely their time and expertise without any form of remuneration or other benefit in kind (2015: Nil). Expenses paid to the trustees in the year totalled £172 (2015: £332). These expenses were made up of three trustees reimbursed for the AGM costs of £88 (2015: £248) and one trustee reimbursed for website hosting costs of £84 (2015: £84)
