TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2019

The trustees present their report together with the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31st December 2019. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 8 to 10 and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1st January 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS102)) and Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102). Legal and administrative details are set out on the 'Charity Information' pages attached hereto.

Principal activities

The objectives of the charity are the preservation, repair, maintenance, beautification and reconstruction of churches in the county of Warwick, the city of Coventry and such other parts of the county of West Midlands which are within the diocese of Coventry and of monuments, bells, blocks and chattels in such churches and of the churchyard belonging to any such churches. This is achieved by providing grants to the churches.

Review of activities

The charity continued its principle activities during the year. Grants totalling £3,500 were paid during the year leaving total of £1,350 approved in prior years not yet paid. No new grants were approved in the year. The trustees consider that the charity will pursue its principle activities for the foreseeable future.

Two principle fundraising activities were completed in the year: the Bard's Ride and Walk and the Ride and Stride in mid September.

The Bard's Ride and Walk was a new activity with two pre planned cycle routes and a walk all taking in a number of churches. Over 60 people took part and together with donations the activity raised nearly £3k after costs. It is hoped that we can build on this in 2020.

The traditional Ride and Stride was also successful generating income of £4k.

Both events were helped by excellent weather.

One trustee retired at the AGM and was warmly thanked for his work over the years. A new trustee was appointed at the meeting.

The Trust also continued to work in partnership with the National Churches Trust (NCT), recommending churches who need larger grants than the Trust can offer, where the projects meet the NCT criteria.

Results

Details of the financial position are set out in the following accounts.

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £4,443 and the net assets at year end amounted to £10,181.

Investment policy and returns

The charity's investments are held in accordance with trustee's powers and the trustees have the authority to invest in such assets as they see fit. The investment returns have been satisfactory, with the underlying investment being a deposit at the Central Board of Finance of the Church of England.

Reserves policy and going concern

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free funds of the charity, at a relatively high level in order to provide sufficient funds to cover operating costs and grants as required. The trustees consider that maintaining reserves of at least one year's expenditure plus anticipated grants should achieve this objective.

The trustees have reviewed the circumstances of the Warwickshire and Coventry Historic Churches Trust and consider that adequate resources continue to be available to fund the activities of the Trust for the foreseeable future. The trustees are of the opinion that the Trust is a going concern. The trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been implemented to mitigate those risks.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective January 2019) – (Charities SORP (FRS102)) the Charities Act 2011 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS102).

b. Income recognition

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income, the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy and it is probable that the income will be received.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

c. Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount or the obligation can be measured accurately.

d. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of the charity. Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used fir particular areas of the Trust's work or for specific projects undertaken by the Trust.

e. Going concern

The trustees have reviewed the circumstances of the Warwickshire and Coventry Historic Churches Trust and consider that adequate resources continue to be available to fund the activities of the Trust for the foreseeable future. The trustees are of the view that the Trust is a going concern.

2. TRUSTEES' EXPENSES AND REMUNERATION

The trustees all give their time and expertise freely and without any form of remuneration or other benefit in kind. (2018: Nil) Expenses paid to trustees in the year totalled £320 (2018: £456). These expenses were made up of reimbursement of AGM costs £116 (2018: £371), postage/stationery costs £73 (2018: £30), Bard's Ride costs £131 (2018: Nil) 2019 also included website hosting costs of £55.
