You must adhere to and obey the Highway Code, local bylaws and laws of England, Scotland, Wales, N. Ireland and extend all reasonable courtesy to other road users.

Young Riders

Parents or guardians of young people under 18 must understand the demands of cycling activity and that they alone can make the decision about the ability of the young person in their care to participate in the Ride on public roads and take appropriate precautions whilst riding. No special provision is made for under 18 riders and DBS checks may not have been made on the event organisers. All riders under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian (or other responsible adult) who will be required to confirm their responsibilities for the young rider on the day of the event.
